

The scale of modern slavery

According to the 2023 Global Slavery Index, an estimated 1.4 in every thousand people were in modern slavery in Finland at any point in 2021. In other words, 5,000 people experienced forced labour or forced marriage in Finland in 2021. In terms of prevalence of modern slavery, Finland ranks 151st globally and 39th within Europe and Central Asia.




Vulnerability to modern slavery

How vulnerable a country's people are to modern slavery is dependent on a range of factors which reflect the strength of governance, access to basic needs, inequality, disenfranchised groups, and effects of conflict. On a scale of 0 to 100, with 100 being the highest vulnerability to modern slavery, Finland is rated as 5 and has below average vulnerability for the region. Vulnerability is highest in terms of disenfranchised groups.

Vulnerability of Finland to modern slavery by dimension of vulnerability, compared to the regional average






Government response to modern slavery

with the regional average

The government of Finland scored 60 out of 100 in their response to modern slavery. This places the government's response above the average regional response. Of the five areas of response assessed (milestones), the government has taken most action on national and regional coordination of the response to modern slavery and the least action on addressing risk in government and business supply chains.

Priority Recommendations for the government of Finland:

- Criminalise forced labour in line with international conventions.
- Ensure support services are available for all victims of modern slavery, regardless of gender, age, nationality, or sexuality.
- Ensure there is a free reporting mechanism that is available for men, women, and children, and that it operates 24/7 and in multiple languages or can provide immediate access to translators.
